### Lightning Strikes Town Hall/ Freewill Baptist Church

Sunday, June 12, 2005 was another hot and humid day. Loudon had begun to feel like the tropics, with oppressive heat during the day and thunderstorms packing torrential rain every afternoon. Even those who had wanted an end to the wet Spring and a beginning to a sunny Summer, were complaining about the heat and humidity.

Early Sunday evening a particularly violent line of storms blew through the area, leaving behind washouts where there had never been problems before, flattened shrubbery, and power outages. Many people remarked about a couple of nasty lightning "snaps" that seemed to hit close by. Mike O'Brien, Clough Hill Road, was about to find out just how close!

Around 8:30, Mike looked out his window to see flames shooting out the front of the Town Hall/Freewill Baptist Church. He immediately called 9-1-1, grabbed his camcorder, and, followed closely by his family, headed out the door.

Captain Robert Bottcher arrived first on the scene and immediately called in a third alarm, adding to the second alarm asked for by Fire Chief Jeff Burr, Sr. before leaving his driveway because he knew this was not going to be an easy fire to handle. The building was old, dry, and timber frame construction with no firewalls. Old church buildings usually burn to the ground.

A Loudon engine arrived right behind Chief Burr. The Chief knew he was facing a "make or break" situation and ordered all 1,000 gallons of water in the engine immediately applied with the deck gun to the front of the building where the flames had broken through. This quieted things down and gave the Fire Department enough time to get hoses laid out, the trucks in position, and water to the building. In addition to Loudon's Fire Department, over 100 fire-fighters and 25 pieces of apparatus from the following towns helped
